GLOBAL TEEN LEADERS ANNOUNCED FOR 2011 JUST PEACE SUMMIT

Thirty-four Teen Leaders from Around the World Are Selected for the 2011 Three Dot Dash Just Peace Summit

New York, NY (January 11, 2011) -- Three Dot Dash, the highly acclaimed global education initiative of **Nile Rodgers'** We Are Family Foundation (WAFF), will hold its third Just Peace Summit in New York City from **March 25 – April 1, 2011**. The Summit is designed to recognize and support the efforts of extraordinary teen leaders around the world. After an international search and competitive nomination process, 34 Global Teen Leaders (GTLs) have been selected by WAFF's esteemed Three Dot Dash Selection Committee to participate in this year's Summit.

Inspired by the late 13 year-old *New York Times* best-selling poet and peacemaker, **Mattie J.T. Stepanek**, Three Dot Dash selects 25 – 35 GTLs who are doing extraordinary work to help ensure basic human needs worldwide – food, water, health, shelter, safety, education and the environment – in the interest of creating a more peaceful society. The 2011 Three Dot Dash GTLs are between the ages of 13 – 19 and represent 15 countries on five continents. They were nominated by a coalition of more than 45 non-governmental organizations (NGOs) and previous GTLs. The 2011 GTLs

are tackling difficult issues including hunger relief, child rights, pollution, clean water, access to education and many more critical problems faced today.

During the Just Peace Summit, the GTLs will be trained in critical thinking and various forms of media to be applied to their projects to expand the scope of their peacemaking efforts. Prior Summit speakers have included *The New York Times* journalist, **Bob Herbert**; award-winning journalist and author, **Sebastian Junger**; CNN's **Soledad O'Brien**; critically acclaimed war photojournalist, **Teun Voeten** and Mattie's Mom, **Dr. Jeni Stepanek**.

"We know the power teens have to create real change when they feel passionate about difficult issues that have affected them or their communities in some way. Our GTLs have positively affected more than 4 million people worldwide over the past two years. This is an astounding accomplishment and testament to the power of young people when given the tools to amplify their work. We are honored to welcome the 2011 GTLs to our family and look forward to helping them amplify their work this year and for years to come," commented **We Are Family Foundation President, Nancy Hunt**.

Before the Summit's conclusion, each GTL will be paired with a mentor who will help guide the work of his/her GTL over the following year. In addition, each GTL will receive a stipend – funds to be spent on the advancement of his/her project.
